2009 MASS, FLOWER, AND LAMP REMEMBRANCES

Books Open Thursday, November 13, 2008

The process for Mass Remembrances will remain the same as 2008. To review:

- Each mass may have up to five persons remembered.
- No monies will be taken for the remembrances.
- No requests will be taken by phone.
- Shut-ins can mail their requests to the Rectory or send them with their Eucharistic Minister.
- Only five requests will be taken within a three-month span to start the year.
- Mass cards will be given for wakes and funerals.

There are several other ways in which you can remember a loved one. They are as follows:

- Entries in our Memorial Mass Book - \$25 each entry. Memorial Masses are held monthly.
- Weekly Sanctuary Lamp Remembrance - \$20 each entry. The lamp burns for one week in memory of your loved one, and the name is announced in our bulletin. Limit two per family to start the year.
- Blessed Mother Altar Flower Requests - \$45 each. Flowers are placed on the altar each week during Ordinary Time in the Liturgical Calendar, and the name is announced in our bulletin. Limit two per family to start the year.
- Daily Spiritual and Memorial Mass Enrollment to St. Charles Seminary. \$10 – 10 years; \$25 – 25 years; \$100 – Perpetual Enrollment.

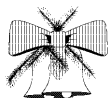
NUNSENSE – IT’S HABIT FORMING

NEWS FROM OUR PARISH NURSES

Is It a Cold or the Flu?

<u>Symptoms</u>	<u>Cold</u>	<u>Flu</u>
Fever	Rare	Characteristic, high (102-104°F), lasts 3-4 days
Headache	Rare	Prominent
General Aches and Pains	Slight	Usual; often severe
Fatigue and Weakness	Quite mild	Can last up to 2-3 weeks
Extreme Exhaustion	Never	Early & prominent
Stuffy Nose	Common	Sometimes
Sneezing	Usual	Sometimes
Sore Throat	Common	Sometimes
Chest Discomfort & Cough	Mild to moderate; hacking cough	Common; can become severe
COMPLICATIONS	Sinus congestion or earache	Bronchitis; pneumonia; can be life threatening
PREVENTION	None; minimize by frequent hand washing; discard tissues; adequate sleep; fluids	Annual Vaccination; amantadine (an antiviral drug)
TREATMENT	Only temporary relief of symptoms	Amantadine within 24 hours after onset of symptoms
